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Question Paper Pattern with Part-A, Part-B and Part-C

All the questions shall be of supply type.

Part-A $(10 \times 2 = 20)$

- Each question shall carry 2 marks.

- ➤ Students shall take around 2 minutes to answer one question.
- ➤ Questions can be in Remember or Understand or lower levels of Apply Cognitive Levels.
- ➤ There shall be two questions from each unit. Out of the two questions, one question shall be from the first half and the second question shall be from the second half of the unit.

Part-B (5×13=65)

Part-C (1×15=15)

- > Students shall take around 35 minutes to answer one question.
- ➤ There shall be one either or question and the questions can be from any unit. Setting questions from the same unit shall be avoided.
- ➤ Questions can be in Apply or higher Cognitive Levels.
